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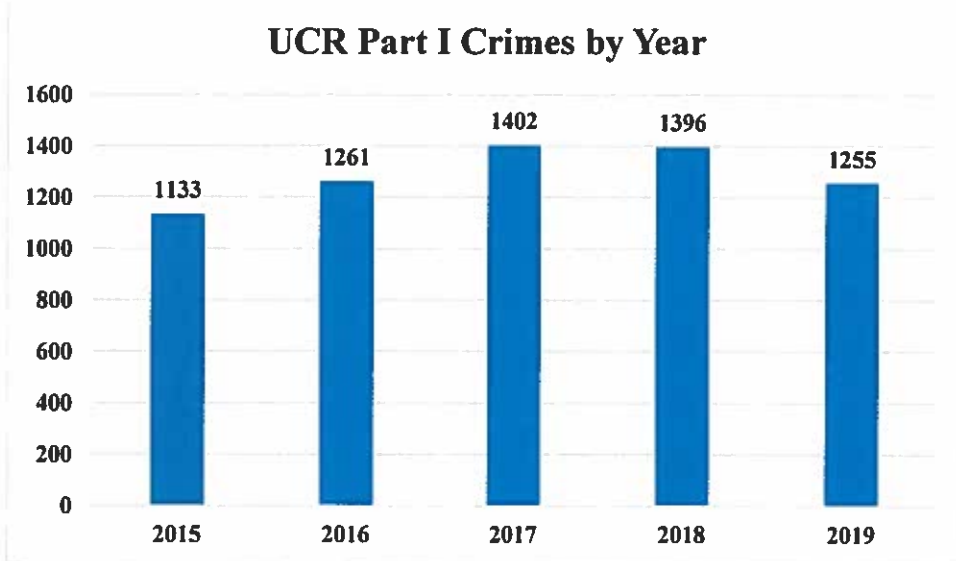
SUBJECT: 2019 CRIME STATISTICS

Each year police departments across the country submit annual crime statistics to their state repository and ultimately these figures are sent to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) to compile the Uniform Crime Report (UCR). The Allen Police Department has completed and submitted its data to the State of Texas. Part I UCR crimes are offenses that include: homicide, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny/theft, motor vehicle theft and arson.

The City is required to follow a national standard or definition for calculating and reporting these offenses to the state and federal governments. The definition for these eight categories of crime do not always align with state law or penal code definitions specific to how criminal charges are filed in our court system. Additionally, the definition of forcible rape changed in 2015 to be inclusive of more sexually based offenses. This change resulted in an increased number of reportable forcible rapes to the state and the federal government.

The data used to compile this report comes from the Allen Police Department's Record Management System. From 2015 to 2017, the City reported a steady increase in Part I UCR crimes. In 2017, total Part I UCR crimes were 1,402 and in 2018, the total amount of crime was 1,396 indicating that crime stayed relatively the same from 2017 to 2018. In 2019, a decrease in crime was observed with 1,255 Part I UCR crimes reported. This represents a 10.10 percent decrease in the number of Part I UCR crimes from 2018 to 2019. Furthermore, every Part I UCR crime category saw a decrease in number of crimes reported from 2018 to 2019.

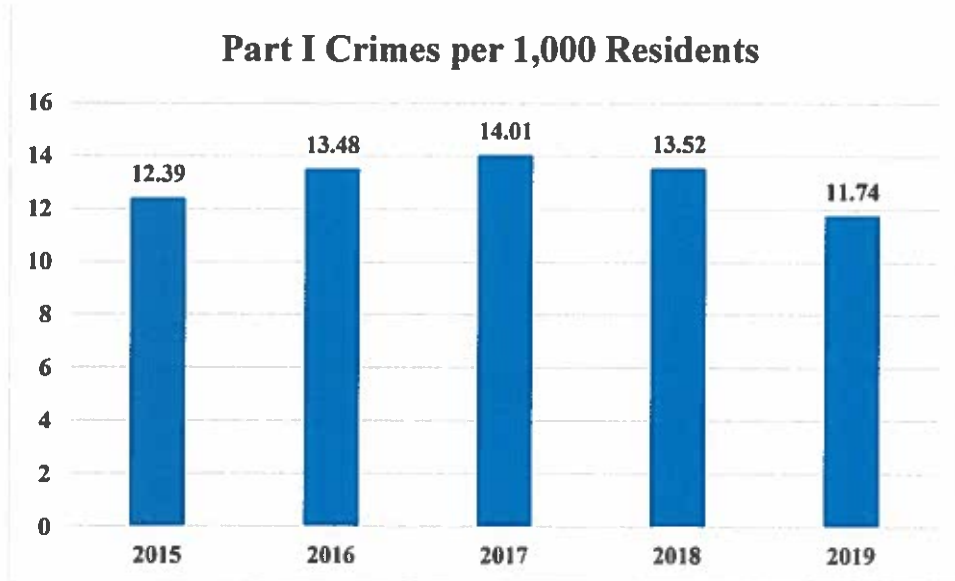


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When comparing crime as a rate between 2018 and 2019, a decrease was observed as well. In 2018, the residential population was 103,272 and the rate of Part I crimes per 1,000 residents was 13.50. In 2019, the residential population was 106,879 making the rate of Part I Crimes per 1,000 residents 11.74. Therefore, the rate of victimization decreased by 13.17 percent.



The Allen Police Department is entering its third year of the Data Driven Approaches to Crime and Traffic Safety (DDACTS) program which addresses crime and traffic concerns in the area around Allen Premium Outlets and The Villages of Allen. Officers are spending more time in the area which has resulted in a greater police presence and contributes to the continual building and fostering of relationships with retailers. The Street Crimes Unit has also partnered with members of the Organized Retail Crime Association (ORCA) to work sting operations in the area to address retail theft. The department is looking at the feasibility of adding an additional DDACTS zone in 2020 to addition crime and traffic safety in another part of the city.

In 2020, with the implementation of a new Records Management System, the police department will gather and report data differently than it currently does. At the moment, the agency reports crime using the Uniformed Crime Reporting (UCR) system which was developed in 1929. UCR gathers data on eight offenses and is prone to under reporting of crime based on its methodology. Recent federal regulations require all law enforcement agencies in the United States to move to the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). NIBRS collects data for 52 offenses, plus 10 additional offenses for which only arrests are reported. Future crime statistics from the department will be generated using this updated reporting system.

The Allen Police continues to monitor crime trends and works closely with other law enforcement agencies in the area to better serve the citizens of Allen. The partnerships that exist and the exchange of information continues to be a successful tool in identifying suspects that often operate as organized gangs.
